

### Boys State Report Summer Convention 2017 Sons of The American Legion

### Greetings Fellow Sons!

The 2017 session of Texas Boys state was our largest ever! We had 1,100 delegates arrive on campus this year. We are excited to continue to grow and keep our program relevant. This year we had 16 more sponsoring posts than last year for a total of 448. We also continue to increase the number of participating schools as well.

There has been some press coverage about the program. I feel that it should be noted that our philosophy is "Learn By Doing." We firmly believe that the delegates, who are the best and brightest in the state need to have a practical application for what they learn during the week. We teach them how the political process works and let them draft and write bills. It is also important to point out that the Texas Boys State program is completely nonpartisan. The delegates are divided into two fictitious parties and then begin to develop their party platform. The administration does not sensor the bills and the election process. The delegates are more informed thanks to technology, they have opinions of their own and those from family and friends. I have always been amazed at the demographics of our program. There are those from small rural towns and from large cities; there are some who have never left home. The delegates meet people from all walks of life and get the chance to learn from others.

In an effort to not re-invent the wheel, I have attached a summary of the Boys State report. The report contains pertinent data from the 2017 session.


