Mission Statement: Support and enable local Posts to increase both quality and quantity of Statesmen representing their Post at TXBS 2025.

Purpose of the online application process:

- Enhance professionalism of applications and the application process.
- Enhance Legion Post awareness and involvement as it relates to applicant qualifications.
- Enhance connection of interested qualified applicants to resources to help join the program.
- Provides cost savings for the American Legion.

Process overview:

1. All **prospective Statesmen** must apply using the online form.
 - Requires completion of academic information as well as submission of resume, transcript, and two essays to help ensure qualified candidate.
2. **Parent/Guardian** approval – link to this step is sent after step one is completed.

3. Obtain a **School Nominator**. This can be any educator (Superintendent, Principal, Teacher, Coach, Counselor, etc.) who knows the student well and can vouch for them. Link to this step is sent after step two is completed.
- Requires verification of academic information and submitting documentation of why the student should be selected to represent their school.
4. **American Legion Post approval** after applicant interview is completed.
- Link to this step is sent after step three is completed.
 - Details from prior step information will be included legion to review, including resume, transcript, and school nominator information.
 - Legion will schedule interview after receiving this notification, then verify completion in this step.
5. Completion of **Financial Sponsorship** details.
- Financial Sponsor is often the Legion Post, family, school, or community organizations/businesses.
 - This step will be activated after all other steps are completed and final review by TX Boys Staff has occurred to ensure all steps were done properly.

Notes of Importance and Frequently Asked Questions:

- Application available online at: <https://www.texasboysstate.com/apply>
- Accurate email addresses are imperative.
 - This is an automated workflow that automatically sends the next form to the person listed in steps 2-5. Mistyped email addresses will prevent applications from continuing to the next person.
- When can applications be started?
 - Now, applications are already open with numerous submissions completed.
- When is the application deadline?
 - May 1st is optimal requested completion deadline with specific timelines up to each post.
- What if a post is concerned about financial sponsorship?
 - There are numerous ways to obtain assistance with financial sponsorship, from working with other community ambassadors, groups, and businesses. While tuition increased slightly to align with increased costs, ensure the best possible program is being provided, and a balanced budget results, this is still a very low-cost program and if a local post is unable to solicit assistance, contact admin@texasboysstate.com to discuss what actions have been done and options to assist.



2025 Statesman Application Process



- What if an applicant is unaware of a Legion Post contact?
 - The application has a "Find a Post" tool and link to the Blue Book file to assist in connecting them with a Legion Post representative in their local area.

Additional Frequently Asked Questions:

- Does a post have access to the applicant's full application?
 - Details are automatically sent to the post once is ready for that step & includes contact email address as well as resume, transcript, essays, & school nominator response.
- How can an application be rejected by a post?
 - After an applicant has invested oneself in the application process, then signed off by the parent, and a school nominator has attested that they are a good candidate, it is unlikely that an applicant would be rejected, yet high quality applicants is of utmost importance. Thus, to reject an application, a post should email admin@texasboysstate.com to discuss why the individual is being rejected to ensure they are not inadvertently being denied due to funding concerns, political differences, or other issues that may be mitigated.
- Can a post pay for shirts for a Statesman during the Financial Sponsorship step?
 - Yes, within the Financial Sponsorship step, it provides an opportunity to purchase shirts and other items for a Statesman – yet, is not required as all Statesman will be provided with one shirt as a part of their tuition. If additional shirts are not purchased in this step, there is still an opportunity for the Statesman to purchase later, prior to showing up to the program.

2025 Statesman Application Process

- If someone is homeschooled/international/non-traditional schooling, who should fill out the Educator form?
 - Whomever is closest with the student on an education-basis can fill out the Educator form, even if it is the same parent who is filling out the Parent approval.
- How can an individual volunteer to assist with the program?
 - There are numerous ways to contribute to the program with a variety of levels of commitment from a few hours on day one to the entire week. This includes tasks such as help during check-in to serving in a role as a counselor.
