




ABOUT THE 1919 SOCIETY



Armed Forces YMCA El Paso Tour

April 11th, 2025

A group of American Legion Family members met with the director Jerry Jacobitz and his assistance Ron Hicks at the Fort Bliss Armed Forces YMCA and was given a tour of their facility. The members who attended was Ray Montano- 16th District Commander, Jane Bennett,16th District Auxiliary President, Myra Cooper, Auxiliary Past Department President, David Blair 16th District SAL Commander, Jean Bennett of Unit 19 Midland, Sharlene Maddox of Unit 19 Midland, Linda Dorsett of Unit 430 Odessa, Vlois Vaughn of El Paso Unit 832, and I Ken Dorsett 4th Division SAL Commander.

Mr. Jacobitz began the tour with details of what the armed force YMCA means to the military families on base. Many families occasionally face financial difficulties and the Armed Forces YMCA is where they can come and get help.

The Grocery items are delivered on Tuesday and volunteers unload the trucks. On Wednesday, the volunteers fill the shelves and place the large or bulk food items on the pallets. On Thursday and Fridays, the doors are open to the military families from 9am – 2 pm. Mr. Jacobitz stated that on the days that the facility is open, there is a line down the street. Those once filled shelves are empty within hours of their opening the door.

As you walk in the building, you will see that in the middle of the room there are pallets of 5-pound bags of potatoes, and bags of onions and cases of Similac. The main room has shelves along an outside wall, which contain nonpartial items such as macaroni, stuffing, and assorted canned goods. There is a cabinet filled with assorted baby food.

Mr. Jacobitz informed the group that the two of the three biggest events occur during the holiday months. They call this time Holiday Joy. In November, gift cards are needed to provide military families stationed at Fort Bliss to purchase a turkey at the commissary. Additionally, a box containing dry goods such as vegetables, instant potatoes, stuffing mix and canned cranberry sauce will be distributed. Funding assistance is needed for these gift cards during this period.

The next event at the facility is "Cookies with Santa," scheduled for December. Each child will have the opportunity to visit Santa and receive cookies along with milk or juice will be provided. Last year, Mrs. Jacobitz baked over 600 cookies for the event. This year, they aim to distribute more than 1,000 cookies.

Due to a family medical procedure, Mr. Jacobitz had to leave, and his assistant, Ron Hicks, continued the tour. The group was taken to the back of the facilities, where the backstock of non-perishable items and canned goods were stored. Mr. Hicks explained that these items are kept in the back to be used in case of emergencies, such as when a new family arrives and needs assistance with food.

The following section pertains to the clothing area. This is where volunteers process the donations they receive. There is a variety of clothing and shoes for women, children, and infants. However, there is a significant need for men's clothing, particularly jeans, dress shirts, dress pants, and suit coats. Often, young men transitioning from the military y to civilian life seek appropriate attire for job interviews, which they are unable to provide. "Therefore, our goal is to begin collecting such items to support them" stated Mr. Hicks. Next, was a room filled with boxes of different sizes of diapers but very few packages of baby wipes. Mr. Hicks stated that the baby wipes are the hardest items to keep in stock. They have handed out

over 1000 packages of baby wipes a month. Diapers and baby wipes are the next biggest concern for the YMCA. Monetary or boxes of either of these items will be greatly appreciated.

The final section of the facility is the thrift store, which houses a variety of items such as shoes, clothing, videos, and more. The room is relatively small and could benefit from additional space. The thrift store operates only on Fridays and offers free items to military families, though there is a limit to the number of items they can take. While most essential items are provided free of charge, some larger toys do have a price tag. This service aims to support the families stationed at Fort Bliss.

The inquiry was made regarding the third annual event organized by the Armed Forces. Mr. Hicks explained that it takes place during the summer, specifically for the children of military personnel, to ensure they have the necessary supplies for the upcoming school year. Each year, the children require backpacks, various school supplies, and insulated lunch bags.

Our goal is to provide as many students as possible with insulated lunch bags and essential items in order to alleviate the potential financial burden on our service members.

Last year the lunch bags, pens and rulers ran about 8,000 dollars for Fort Cavazos. My project is to include Armed Services YMCA Food Bank at Fort Bliss, I understand that I need to raise about 7,000 dollars for this by the end of May 2025.

I'm asking for any donations for my project, we would not be free if it weren't for our Men and Women and their families that serve our great nation.


