Reports of Committees (if applicable)

Harl "Butch" Ray, Chairman:

Ray stated National Membership & Squadron Activities is a committee under the Internal Affairs Commission. Although the proposed theme has not yet been approved it most likely will be following the upcoming Internal Affairs Meeting. This year's proposed theme is ABC easy as 1,2,3. ABC- "Always Buddy Check", 1- Recruit one new member to The American Legion (Get a "I Got One" shirt at recruiters expense.) 2- Recruit one new member and renew one member to the SAL (Get our external gratitude). 3- Sign up 3 for the Legion, 3 for the Auxiliary and 3 for the SAL (Get a "Family Three" pin)

42,000 members did not renew for 2025. Buddy Checks are imperative. Scripts on how to conduct Buddy Checks will be provided to assist Squadrons in the near future.

The membership goal for 2026 is 409,244 members. Goals were provided to all Detachments in August. This goal number represents a modest 0.97 percent increase over the 400,000 member goal.

Retention will be the number one focus this year. We need to push to reach over a 90 percent retention rate. Again, Buddy Checks (ABC) will be structured with scripts where you will be checking on the members well-being, be missed and not just calling to collect dues. Member engagement is a must. It has been requested that the Consolidated Squadron Reports be broken down by Detachment and provided to them as a recruitment tool to showcase what the Squadrons across the Detachment have accomplished.

Discussion was made to align our National Membership Goals closer to the American Legion Goals to encourage members to renew earlier as Membership Cards expire on December 31st. Marc Chaney (OR) provided feedback that The American Legion has a PUFL program which allows them to have those higher goals.

Last year's accomplishments were reviewed including but not limited to reaching 400,000 members and submitting multiple resolutions regarding the Blue Brigade Award, Recruiter of the Year, Squadron Commander of the Year and Triple Nickel.

A Squadron Activities Toolkit is being worked on with suggested activities.

It was discussed that Membership Renewal Notice dates should be sent out earlier.



Reports of Members

Steven Honigfort, National Vice Commander Central:

The Central Region has had a slow and steady start. Honigfort mentioned the Detachments are tired from working last year working to reach that 400k but keeping the pressure on.

Phil Stander, Regional Membership Rep Central:

Central Region is currently sitting at third place with Illinois and Wisconsin leading the region. Buddy checks are being encouraged and the region is keeping the momentum going.

Chris Casey, National Vice Commander Midwest:

On the Regional Call the Detachments are doing many great things. The Midwest Region always does well with retention.

Casey Hanson, Regional Membership Rep Midwest:

History has shown that those who do not hit the membership goals from the start will not reach them moving forward. Five Detachments have already met the 25 percent goal. Detachments are being challenged to reach 90 percent by December 31st. An award will be given to the first Detachment to do so. This provides an incentive to get Detachments closer to meeting that goal. Ray also suggested incentives such as early birds and discounts for paying early.

Henry Hasselhan, Regional Membership Rep Northeast:

The Northeast Region is in last place, however the Region is number two for the number of members for 2026. Buddy Checks need to be conducted as a retention tool. New Jersey has already reached the 25 percent goal.

Jeremy Revell, National Vice Commander Northeast:

The Northeast is notorious for having a slow start due to so many members. Many of the Detachments have a "Secret Sauce" and we need to collect that information and share it with all Detachments.

Bryan Hine, National Vice Commander Southeast:

Regional Rep Scott Williams is doing a great job. 8,600 members ahead of this time last year.

Scott Williams, Regional Membership Rep Southeast:

The Southeast is first place with Louisiana, Alabama and Georgia all above goal.



Reports of Members (continued)

Thom Skelley, Leading Candidate for National Commander:

Soon kids will be knocking on your door to collect candy. Everyone in the room are the kids who need to go out and collect the candy (the members). Last year 120-150 Individual Recruitment Award Pins were handed out. We need to do better and get those members to earn their pins. These pins can also be used as a conversation starter to engage members. To retain members we need to find their purpose. Members are not being engaged. What do they like to do? Drive their purpose. Member Engagement Teams are a good way to make sure those new members are being mentored and engaged. Assign someone to them to keep them from walking out the door.

Mike Monserud, Trailing Candidate for National Commander:

If we do not have membership, we do not exist. Everyone can recruit one person. Re-think how you work your programs and think outside of the box. Focus on Children & Youth. Those younger members are needed. In your communities, find something that creates visibility. We need to go get new members, they are not coming to us. If you work the programs, they will work for us. Membership through mentorship. We lose members between 2-3 years, we need to engage our members and get them involved. We must communicate and everyone must continue to get the information out.

Frank Meraz, National Vice Commander West:

Matt Griffis is doing a great job as membership rep. The top two Detachments are the Philippines and Hawaii.

Matt Griffis, Regional Membership Rep West:

We must be motivators and motivate the Detachments and Squadrons. 7 out of 15 Detachments are already above 25 percent and 3 are close behind. Some need to be motivated. Gary Manwell of Arizona is continuing his Backpack Laptop Program and the package costs \$300. Griffis indicated he would personally be purchasing one backpack for each Detachment.

Harl "Butch" Ray, Chairman:

Butch's Bullet Points will continue each month. Everyone is encouraged to share. 52 percent of Posts do not have Squadrons. Check with your Detachments. Visit the Posts and let them know what we can do for them.

Committee Members were provided with their sub-committee assignments. Anyone who feels it is not a good fit or they have other interests to please reach out.

WHEREAS, in the 1970s a Sons of The American Legion Liability Account was established as a restricted fund in the event of emergencies such as membership decline, etc., and temporary funds were needed to meet expenses; and

WHEREAS, the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, May 4-5, 2005 by NEC Resolution No. 6 established a ceiling of \$500,000 (with a variance of +/- 1.5%) for the Sons of The American Legion Liability Fund Account for each budget year ending in the month of December and be reviewed annually by the Internal Affairs Commission of The American Legion at the Spring meetings for adequacy and from a fiscal management viewpoint; and

WHEREAS, the Sons of The American Legion Restricted Fund is presently over the variance established; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the National Executive Committee of the Sons of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana on May 3-4, 2025, that a donation in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) be made to The American Legion Veterans and Children's Foundation (VCF); and be it further
