Local Business Recognized

Sons of the American Legion (SAL) Squadron 105 of Belleville, NJ took a trip to North Plainfield the Tuesday before Thanksgiving to drop off a plaque to HK Truck Center, to thank them for their continued support of the squadron's programs.

Each year, Squadron 105 sets up shop outside the ShopRite on Washington Avenue in Belleville, to do a 'can shake' and hand out small American Flags. This year being the fifth year of the fundraiser, members from the Legion Family were down there for two shifts a day, for a week from Friday 3 November to Friday 10 November.

The thousands of dollars raised each year go directly back to SAL programs which benefit veterans and children in the local community, throughout New Jersey, and for national initiatives of the American Legion.
